TYPE 2 DIABETES CLINICAL RESEARCH STUDY – T2NOW

Looking for Young People Aged 10-17 years – We are hoping that over 240 young people aged 10 to 17 years from around the world will take part in this study, which will last just over one year, with one last visit occurring one year later. Eligible participants will be given study medication as an addition to their other regular diabetes medicine (metformin and/or insulin) as their doctor prescribes. They will be asked to attend regular appoints with the study doctor in person and over the phone. Participants in the study may be reimbursed for travel and food expenses to attend appointments. To be eligible to take part in the study, participants need to:

- Be aged 10 to 17 years
- Have Type 2 Diabetes
- Be on metformin and/or insulin
